When receiving an “S” you will receive credit hours for the class, but no grade points; your GPA will not be affected. Should you receive a “U”, you will not receive credit hours or grade points, your GPA will not be affected. However, the hours will count toward attempted hours. A grade of “S” cannot be repeated unless the course is normally graded S/U. This option is not recommended for Computer Science majors.
